

Counting Coins: Pennies and Nickels Worksheet - Answer Key

1st Grade - counting pennies and nickels | 12 minutes

Count each set of coins. Write the total amount in cents (¢).

Example: nickel + nickel + penny = $5 + 5 + 1 = 11¢$

Answer: 3¢ | ② 1 nickel

| ③ 2 nickels + 1 penny
Answer: 11¢ | ④ 1 nickel + 4 pennies
Answer: 9¢ |

Answer: 15¢ | ⑥ 2 nickels + 3 pennies
Answer: 13¢ |
| ⑦ 1 nickel + 2 pennies
Answer: 7¢ | ⑧ 4 nickels
Answer: 20¢ |
| ⑨ 3 nickels + 2 pennies
Answer: 17¢ | ⑩ 2 nickels + 5 pennies
Answer: 15¢ |
| ⑪ 1 nickel, 1 nickel, 1 penny, 1 penny, 1 penny
Answer: 13¢ | ⑫ Which is worth more: a nickel or a penny?
Answer: a nickel ($5¢ > 1¢$) |

Challenge

- ⑬ You have 2 nickels and 4 pennies. How much money in all?
Answer: $2 \times 5 = 10$, then $10 + 4 = 14¢$
- ⑭ How many pennies are equal to one nickel?
Answer: 5 pennies ($5 \times 1 = 5¢$)
