

Making Change Worksheet - Answer Key

2nd Grade - making change within one dollar | 14 minutes

Find the change. Subtract the cost from the money paid. Write the change in cents.

Example: A pencil costs 40 cents. You pay 50 cents. Change = $50 - 40 = 10$ cents.

1. A pencil costs 40 cents. You pay with 50 cents. How much change?

Answer: 10 cents

2. A toy costs 75 cents. You pay with 100 cents (\$1). How much change?

Answer: 25 cents

3. A snack costs 60 cents. You pay with 70 cents. How much change?

Answer: 10 cents

4. A sticker costs 35 cents. You pay with 50 cents. How much change?

Answer: 15 cents

5. An eraser costs 25 cents. You pay with one quarter. How much change?

Answer: 0 cents (exact)

6. A juice costs 80 cents. You pay with \$1. How much change?

Answer: 20 cents

Challenge

7. You have 2 quarters and buy a 30-cent item. How much change, and what coins could you get back?

Answer: 20 cents - for example, 2 dimes.

8. An item costs 45 cents. You pay with 3 quarters (75 cents). How much change?

Answer: 30 cents
