Read the passage:

Few animals travel as far as the sea turtle. A female sea turtle may swim thousands of miles across the ocean to return to the very same beach where she was born. There, at night, she crawls onto the sand, digs a deep nest, and lays around one hundred eggs. Then she returns to the sea, leaving the eggs behind. About two months later, tiny hatchlings dig their way out and scramble toward the bright horizon over the water. This dash is dangerous - crabs, birds, and other animals wait to eat them, and only a few survive to adulthood. Today sea turtles face new dangers from people, too. Plastic trash in the ocean can be mistaken for food, and lights from buildings near the beach can confuse hatchlings, sending them the wrong way. Many people now work to protect nesting beaches and keep the ocean clean, hoping these ancient travelers will continue their journey for generations to come.
